Special Guest:

Dr. Bert Emerson: My name is Bert Emerson. I teach in the English Department, direct the honors program, and serve in other various roles on campus. I was invited to talk about the Democracy lab. It launched in 2021 with a few students. It started to see how social media impacted democratic operations but evolved into some new ideas. We want to have something like STEM labs and bring in different disciplines but especially for students in humanities and social sciences who are interested in issues pertaining to civic engagement. Like summer stem programs it will be a stipend over the summer to work. We got another round of funding this past year where we had 3 students and 2 faculty members. The vision is to invite students to develop projects. One of the biggest projects is to see how the campus climate on democratic involvement exists. Last year we had a democratic speaker series. Often in the years without presidential elections we have a lot of smaller things being worked on. We had a banned books club started up over the summer. We think that the work you do here goes with you. We are looking for other things we can be doing on campus. We had a student going around campus with survey on

campus climate. We're looking forwards to figuring out what we are going to do with the results. We want this to be an opportunity for students to work over the summer in a different type of lab setting.

Alea: Where can I reach you? Is there an email I can reach you with?

Bert: We have a website right now that lists a few of our projects over the years. Sometimes honors projects are put on there. We don't just think of democracy as politics but as community as well. It's in infant stages at the moment. Funding this summer isn't super clear but in a couple summers I hope to get 50k for student work. I want a model like the STEM summer research. I'm also working with the office of church engagement right now.

Kaleb: This type of elbow deep work in social studies/ demographics has always interested me. I'm really excited to see where this goes. I think this is an amazing project

Bert: it's a new kind if thing. We want it to be multidisciplinary. We want to think about so many things. At the end of the day the goal is to strengthen everyone's voices. I think there's a reason for people not to get involved but we can do things differently because we are on a college campus.
