Jerrichalynn Stripedwolf: Hello, my name is Jerrichalynn Stripedwolf, I am the president of the new ISA at Whitworth this year. I have had engagement with about 10 consistent members at my Talking Circle events. We have discussed advocacy and ways as college students we can serve indigenous communities; we have had discussions on belonging and indigenous health disparities. We hosted a Fry Bread night which was a big hit for engagement, I led a discussion on the cultural significance and made my fry bread recipe for about 25 people. Dr Naomi Bender attended. We are planning on hopefully Naomi coming on November 14th to discuss Learning Holistic ways of healing through trauma. The event will be in the HUB MPR and indigenous eats will be catered and we hope to have Dr. Naomi Bender, an Indigenous Peruvian Quechua, the Inaugural Director of Tribal Relations for Spokane Colleges, who brings over 25 years of working with tribal

communities in both the Midwest and the Pacific Northwest. Prior to joining Spokane Colleges, she served as Director of Native American Health Sciences and the Director for the Center for Native American Health at Washington State University in Spokane, and in both roles, cultivated strong partnerships that provided support for indigenous-centered education. She's done amazing things with her career.

My end goals for ISA remain the same, I would love for a class on traditional herbal medicine and healing ways to be integrated into the course system. I would love to push for a trip to eastern powwow in the spring, and Mt. Spokane for huckleberry picking. I want to coordinate a campus wide powwow by the time I graduate.
