Special Guest

Baily Sauls: good evening everyone. This is the first ASWU meeting I've ever been to. Very grateful to be invited by Isaac. Something about values caucus which is happening tomorrow at the MPR at 8:00 PM so it also functions as prime time and all the buildings. Values Caucus is part of the litany of election programming that a group of faculty and staff kind of been putting together throughout this fall. so I will just talk briefly about what purposes and then kind of how the event actually works and then if you have questions, I can answer them. The purpose of the event is to help individuals like students on campus think more critically about how we vote and what are the values that we hold that inform how we how we vote and how we talk about politics and practice civic engagement and then it's also an effort to help us see that other people especially those who think differently than us, or vote different also are informed by values as well because it can be really easy to just say you are right to make kind of like oh I think you are behaving or saying this thing, I think you're a terrible person rather than at least at the very least seeking to kind of bridge some divides in the kind of the way that we've been polarized past several decades politically and then to also give all of us a sense of who we are as a university one of the things that we most commonly hold as values. So that's kind of the purpose. This is derived from an activity I did what I was actually in grad school, university in Indiana but essentially the way that it works is Christa maroni and I, the director of residence life put together a survey that some of you may have taken that was just an anonymous kind of straw poll of what are the things that students care about and then also like who are you voting for was the question we asked. We found in the data that close to 20% of campus when they took the survey was still undecided which was kind of pretty surprising to me and that we are all over the map we are very moderate campus so we were pretty split down the middle of both party affiliation wise and in terms of who people are planning to vote for. So we are all things and therefore also kind of no one thing but we are taking the top six policy issues placing them at different parts of the walls in the MPR those issues which you all campus said - immigration, gun rights or gun violence, abortion and reproductive rights, climate change LGBTQ+ rights and it's always the last one you forget. they'll come back but those are the six and so collectively in that as a whole student body all the participants will kind of name the values that we associate with how we think about those policies if that makes sense. so rather than thinking about what is the actual policy here what are some things that I might really deeply value that would inform why I care about this thing so once we decide on those six sets of policies then we'll caucus for those values rather than caucusing for candidates, so I'll be up there moderating and we'll say OK which of these sets of values resonates most with you? You are going to stand by your set of values and then we slowly eliminate the least popular sets of values so this time each round if you will of the caucus where you kind of get to talk to different people about OK why are these values that I care about with the hope that we kind of distill it down to two sets of values that we most care about to kinda inform OK what are the things that we as a campus really value and what does that say about the policies that those have been attached to. so we're really trying to separate from we're not trying to talk about candidates or even policy at a partisan level we're really trying to get down to thinking really deeply and critically about how we are participating in this election season so that's the gist of it. what questions did you have?

Niraj: Is it like a small group format?

Baily: it'll be how many people will show up. so the idea not many people familiar with what the caucus is. So when you vote to nominate some seats instead of having a statewide primary essentially use caucusing to take using sampling essentially but it does very function like how far a candidate makes it in the caucus is how many delegates they get in their in that states primary caucus and so that's sort of the same format but it's open to everyone it's open as well to people who either are choosing not to vote or are not able to vote in this election because it will still help us inform how we think about civic engagement and politics and things like that.

Isaac: so, you're interacting kind of one on one with different people?

Baily: It will be collectively all together we will decide on the values that we think are most represented by each of the six policies and then yeah you can group up you may be in a small group so say you really identify with the values that we express that are most closely associated with immigration policy you'll then be in a group of people with with immigration you'll talk to them but then you'll also talk to people from other groups to kind of try and convince them or at least express here's why I really care about this set of values why do you care about this of value? so you might be with people who ultimately think about that policy very differently than you but that's sort of the point and so it might be uncomfortable I think that's good. any other questions? Cool beans. Thank you all! Hopefully see you all tomorrow.
