Assembly Meeting Proposal

Christian: Applications for elections were due today at 5:00pm, but please still encourage candidates for some Senators to apply. We still have some areas open. There's an option to write in, so their name won't be on the ballot but they can have enough people write in, making them a candidate. Next, we are going to go over rules and violations so we have the most eyes looking over potential campaign violations. All senators are only allowed to hang election material in the Residence Hall that they are running for. For example, Mac can only hang in Mac. For execs, off campus and international senator, they can hang in the hub and academic buildings. All posters must be given approval from SEC so they must have a stamp in the corner. Also, on election day there is no active campaigning. Posters can stay up election day however. We want to make things as fair as possible. Samie, anything else?

Christian: As we go into next week, please take a picture of any campaign violations and send to Samie. Next, we have voting booth sign ups. We will have a table to encourage people to vote.

Samie: Tabling will be from 9:00am-1:00pm. We will cap it to two people per session. Sessions will be from 9:00am-10:00am, 10:00am-11:00am, 11:00am-12:00pm, 12:00pm-1:00pm. Is anyone available next Friday to help with this? Candidates cannot do this but if you are an SEC member you can.
